MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada is one of only seven professional ballet companies in Canada and the largest professional performing arts organization in New Brunswick. I feel very strongly that quality of life is an integral part of economic development, and the performing arts form an essential part of that equation. Fostering artistic excellence and creativity are essential to the future growth of our provincial and regional economy. The Board of Directors takes great pride in supporting and promoting this remarkable organization along with Susan, Igor, the exceptional artists of the company, and our tireless staff.

On behalf of the Board I am pleased to report that the implementation of the Strategic Plan proceeded with significant progress made toward achievement of our strategic goals.

We have continued to tour throughout Canada reaching audiences from Newfoundland to British Columbia. At home our work to educate youth on intimate partner violence, through our ballet Ghosts of Violence and educational program Celebrate Courage, is growing. We have also had substantial increases in our educational programs for youth. These programs are essential pillars of the organization. We strongly believe that the professional arts are a vehicle for positive social, artistic and educational outcomes.

I also want to thank, the board of directors for their volunteer commitment and efforts on behalf of the company and also the wonderful volunteers who give so much of their time and energy to our organization.

MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDERS



2014-2015 was an invigorating year on many levels.

Artistically we created a new work to Ravel's BOLERO and partnered with the fantastic woodwind quintet Ventus Machina.

We were delighted to be back on the international stage in Germany in October with Phantom of the Opera. In Canada we toured our ballet Piaf to British Columbia, Alberta and Quebec, nurturing a whole new audience for ballet in communities across the country.

Ghosts of Violence continued in Atlantic Canada. We take great pride in the impact that this program is making across the region. The on-going feedback from teachers, students, guidance counsellors and community partners is a clear demonstration of the impact our art is having on the lives of our youth.

We were very pleased to organize and host the highly successful HOMEbody Symposium, which took place on May 6^{th} , 2015. The HOMEbody Symposium was a public engagement initiative

of Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada organized in partnership, with artist-in-residence Shannon Litzenberger, whose performance HOMEbody inspired the event, along with Artslink NB. The provincial event was organized as an inspired dialogue on shaping New Brunswick's future with post-secondary students and newcomers to the province, along with entrepreneurs, thought-leaders, artists, academics, social enterprises and industry specialists.

We know that the arts allow us to reflect on our current situation and imagine alternatives to the status quo. Arts are a means to engage communities in public dialogue and provide a powerful tool for community mobilization. As the HOMEbody Symposium beautifully illustrated, the arts help us tell our stories, reflect and learn from these stories, and shape our collective future.

Our education programs also experienced positive growth. Our International Summer Ballet Intensive brought students to our province from as far away as Japan. We were pleased to welcome special guest faculty Allen Kaeja of Kaeja d'Dance in Toronto, and the distinguished ballet icon, international choreographer, master teacher and previous Artistic Director of Boston Ballet, Anna-Marie Holmes. On the other end of the spectrum we expanded our Ballet in the Schools program – a program for kindergarten students – with over 250 students participating. We also saw significant development in our Arts After School program. Encouraging creativity in our youth is one of our most rewarding activities, especially knowing that participation in the arts will send them on a positive path in life.

Strengthening existing partnerships and growing new ones has allowed us to continue to expand our artistic experiences, our audiences and to positively impact communities at home and abroad.

NEW CREATION - BOLERO



In November 2014, Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada was thrilled to partner with the outstanding woodwind quintet VENTUS MACHINA for the presentation of our Artistic Director's newest creation: BOLERO. It was a brilliant evening of movement harmony and vitality with the virtuoso dancers of the company. Bolero was presented in Moncton and Fredericton. BOLERO was originally composed as a ballet commissioned by Russian actress and dancer Ida Rubinstein. The piece, which premiered in 1928, is Ravel's most famous musical composition and epitomizes Ravel's preoccupation with restyling and reinventing dance movements. Igor Dobrovolskiy's interpretation cleverly conveys human emotion within the landscape of movement in a way that redefines Ravel's great score.


PHANTOM OF THE OPERA ON THE INTERNATIONAL STAGE

HOMEbody Symposium Inspires May 6, 2015, Fredericton NB

Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada was thrilled to organize and host a provincial symposium on building New Brunswick's future.

The HOMEbody Symposium 2015, was a public engagement initiative of Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada. The symposium focused on shaping the future of New Brunswick by bringing together over 246 participants, representing a cross-section of community builders, post-secondary students from across the province and newcomers to New Brunswick.

The HOMEbody Symposium was developed in partnership with artist-in-residence, and creator of the HOMEbody performance, Shannon Litzenberger whose artistic work inspired the event, as well as Artslink NB.

The packed full bilingual symposium included hearing the stories of twenty-two entrepreneurs, including emerging businesses, place makers, newcomers and social ventures that are "making it" in New Brunswick. Their stories helped shape the conversation on what can be achieved in New Brunswick. The day's dialogue culminated in challenging participants to " Create their Story" of why New Brunswick is a great place to live, work, innovate and create by identifying assets, key opportunities and possible projects and narratives on how to build the province's future.


GHOSTS OF VIOLENCE

Ghosts of Violence is an award winning multi media production and cornerstone of Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada's national initiative Celebrate Courage, which brings the issue of intimate partner violence into the spotlight. Celebrate Courage is a ground-breaking national program developed by the company to build awareness and dialogue on intimate partner violence in communities large and small across Canada.

In partnership with front line service providers, Celebrate Courage works within a collaborative interactive setting that includes Ghosts of Violence, a community education campaign, educational tools and on-site education for students and youth. Celebrate Courage and Ghosts of Violence continued as an educational program for students in Atlantic Canada in 2014 and 2015.

OUTCOMES

All students completed a questionnaire following the presentation. The results are positive. A majority of students reported learning more about domestic/intimate partner violence than before and also learning more about services in their community.

- An important outcome is the number of students who said that they would do something or speak up if they knew of someone in this situation – 77%. Research shows that most teens will not speak about this issue when they have knowledge of it. "Breaking the Silence" around Intimate partner violence is one of the greatest challenges. This result is very encouraging.
- Important also are the number of students who learned about the services in their community – 72%. This is a key component of our model to ensure students have knowledge and access to services if they need help.
- Positively 73% reported that they understood more about intimate partner violence after attending the presentation.



Igor Dobrovolskiy Receives Prestigious Arts Award

In 2014, Artistic Director and choreographer Igor Dobrovolskiy was awarded the Lieutenant Governor's Award for High Achievement in the Arts; New Brunswick's highest artistic honour!

The Lieutenant-Governor's Awards for High Achievement in the Arts is a juried program designed to recognize the outstanding contribution of artists to the arts in New Brunswick and to establish standards of artistic excellence for New Brunswick residents. Three awards are determined each year, one each in three categories to recognize and reward artists who have distinguished themselves by the excellence of their achievements. The award categories are: literary arts, performing arts (dance, music, and theatre), and visual arts. Award recipients each receive \$20,000.

INTERNATIONAL SUMMER BALLET INTENSIVE

In July 2015 we held our 2nd annual three week Summer International Ballet Intensive program. Located in our beautiful studios and company headquarters, the Summer Ballet Intensive is led by an international faculty with special guest teachers Anna-Marie Holmes, former Artistic Director at the Boston Ballet, and Allen Kaeja of Kaeja d'Dance in Toronto. Students came from all over NB and as far away as Japan!

The program offers the serious ballet student an intensive, high level of instruction that includes 4 - 6 hours of class and choreography daily, Monday through Friday. The daily curriculum includes: classical ballet technique, variations, pointe, character dance, duet class and choreography. Boys' technique classes are available, including individual coaching. Enrichment classes are in jazz, modern, classical character, and core conditioning classes. In addition there are a number of professional development lectures, including topics such as injury prevention, wellness, and nutrition.

YOUNG ARTIST PROGRAM

The Company extends the scope of training for aspiring young dancers wherever it tours. Master classes and repertoire workshops at this level are opportunities that are usually only available in large city centres. We offer this unique experience in cities, towns and rural locales throughout the Atlantic region and across the country. We also open Company class and rehearsals to dance students wherever we perform, giving young artists a look into the life, dedication, and work of a professional dancer.

TD SPOTLIGHT ON KIDS



Spotlight on Kids is a program that benefits children and youth who face economic barriers. It gives many their first chance to experience the magic of theatre. Every season, 2,000 performance tickets are made available to schools and groups helping underserved children. Thanks to our long-standing partnership with TD Bank Financial Group, youth throughout the Atlantic region have benefited from this enrichment for many years.

BALLET IN THE SCHOOLS MCCain



Recognized by the Department of Education in support of physical literacy for young children, Ballet in the Schools is a unique enrichment program for kindergarten students in ballet/movement education taught by our professional faculty.

In 2014-2015, children in the following schools had the chance to take part in the Ballet in the Schools program: Riverview East (October - November 2014), Arnold H. McLeod in Moncton (January - March, 2015), and Evergreen School in Moncton (April – May, 2015). In total over 250 students participated in the program. The Ballet in the Schools program culminated in a student show at every school.



DEVELOPING THE NEXT GENERATION

Founded in 2012, Atlantic Ballet Theatre of Canada's Centre for Arts & Education focuses on youth performance education. The Centre offers a performance-based program integrating professional-level training in ballet, musical theatre (voice, dance, acting), stage production, and arts leadership, culminating in the opportunity to participate in full-length, full-scale musical theatre/dance performances on the stage.

Professional educators and artists who work in the performing arts teach students at the Centre. We offer an inspiring learning environment focused on building creativity, artistry, and discipline while developing self-confidence and performance skills for the stage and in life! The breadth of our program means that every student has an opportunity to develop, to be engaged and to learn within at least one discipline. All of our students have the opportunity to appear on stage in two full-scale productions.




